Alliteration - Alliteration is the repetition of the same letter or sound at the beginning of words that are closely connected e.g. watery weather washes out Wales

Broadsheet - A type of newspaper that generally focuses on more serious, in-depth reporting

Caption - Help to tell the story by explaining a picture

Fact - When something is undeniably true

Headline - Used to grab your attention and try to tell the story in as few words as possible

Opinion - A view or judgement, not necessarily based on fact

Pun - A joke that exploits the different possible meanings of a word

Quote - To repeat or copy out words that someone has spoken or written

Sub-heading - An additional headline or title that comes immediately after the headline or a heading given to a paragraph of writing

Tabloid - A type of newspaper that generally reports on scandals, gossip and celebrities in a sensational way
